Technology News

East Jackson Community Schools is excited to announce that our use of technology to accelerate learning in the classroom is expanding in the Fall of 2014!

- ◇ iPads: Four additional classrooms will be equipped with iPads for each student in grades Kindergarten-3rd grade this school year.
- ◇ Google Chromebooks: Six additional classrooms in grades 4-12 will have Chromebooks available for each student.
- ◇ A dozen teachers engaged in intensive technology training within the last six months to build lesson plans in order to utilize a consistent technology presence in their classroom.
- ◇ Smart Boards in every classroom continue to be utilized in new ways to make visual learning more effective.

Powerschool will continue to play a large role in communicating with parents this year. Report cards and progress reports will be sent regularly to parents' e-mail in order to keep you informed of your child's academic performance. Please be sure to provide accurate information to be entered into Powerschool so you are sure not to miss any of these important communications!



BOND UPDATE!

Continued praise and appreciation goes out to voters for their support for the May 2014 Bond Election. The vote was a clear message of support and anticipated growth of our schools.

Currently, design work is underway. Staff and architects are reviewing every aspect of the Walz Road property, which will now be known as East Jackson Elementary School. Here are some highlights:

- ◇ East Jackson Elementary School will be open for Kindergarten - 6th grade students on the first day of school, Fall of 2015!
- ◇ Safety is a high priority! This includes new pick up / drop off loops, a more secure office and entry way, and playground equipment designed with safety in mind.
- ◇ First class technology will be a main focus, with many student devices ready for engagement on day one.
- ◇ Top considerations include increasing natural light and positive air flow to provide optimum learning conditions and conservation of energy as well.
- ◇ A community room will be located near the new office to support groups who need meeting space.
- ◇ A new roof is schedule to be installed in the Fall of 2014.


Facility Scheduling

Wow! Summer has finally arrived, and it certainly took long enough to get here. With the warmer weather we had the pleasure of saying goodbye to our senior class of 2014. The wonderful ceremony took place on May 23rd and it was a proud day for me to be a part of their celebration. With the seniors departing and moving on, we begin the planning and preparation for the 2014-15 school year.

In preparation for the 2014-15 school year, I would like to share with you some of the great initiatives we are continuing and developing here in the Secondary building. As a staff we have spent our time collaborating and developing essential learning outcomes for our students in grades 7-12. These outcomes will be determined as skills that students must know to be successful within their current class, but also moving forward. The staff has embraced this work and we are looking forward to continuing the process next year.

In support of our initiatives, we will be adding two math support classes next year. We will have one at the 7th and 8th grade levels. These classes will be for 10-15 students that have been identified as needing re-teaching and remediating supports. Having these classes will allow students to receive the additional time and instruction to improve their overall math performance. We are very excited to have this in place for our students and hope to continue similar support classes in the future. We have also added an Academic Intervention position at our 9th grade level. This person will also be academically supporting 10-15 students in the 9th grade, again providing additional support in the area of math.

I look forward to continuing the great work we have begun for our students this year. My door is always open and I encourage you to stop in or call with any questions or concerns. This is a community school, which means we need to educate as a community. If you are interested in being active in this community, please contact me. We would certainly welcome your interest and participation in our school. Above are important dates beginning our 2014-15 school year. If for some reason you cannot attend our orientations or open house, please stop in and see me. I would be glad to spend the time to make sure your student has a solid foundation for next year.







Robinson's Music Program

The Robinson Elementary students have been busy this spring sharing music with our community with two spring concerts. Students at Robinson have general music classes every week all year long where they sing, play instruments, and study the history of American and world music. The 6th grade band students meet every day for rehearsal. Students also meet by section once a week during their last recess as they begin to learn to play their individual instruments and as an ensemble player in the band as a whole.

The student musicians performed and sang at the spring concerts in April with the 6th grade band and 6th grade general music classes in one concert and the 4th and 5th grade students combined to perform on a separate night "Together We Can Change the World". The audience in attendance was given a view into the music class rooms at Robinson as they watched the 6th graders demonstrate world rhythms on the drums while singing traditional songs from many different countries. The 6th grade band lead the audience down a path of their discovery into wind instrumental playing with demonstrations from the beginning of the year to playing several accomplished ensemble pieces learned together. The 4th graders sang and played xylophones and marimbas joined with the fifth graders signing and recorder playing as they shared with the audience personal, economical, and environmental changes that can help change our world today. The students worked hard to prepare for these performances and did an excellent job sharing their music.

The 6th Grade Band performed for the fifth graders on May 16th to show the band instruments. Mr. Miller visited the fifth grade classes and fit them for instruments as they get ready for next year's 6th grade band. Parent letters and information will be coming home to assist each family with their selection. The 6th grade students are signing up for their continued band participation into the middle school band and also into the middle school choir for next year. The students have learned and grown this year in their music education and we look forward to their future music endeavors at Robinson and at the Secondary School.
