Reports

1) Finance Report

• Interim Business Manager, Nancy Swanson presented the Finance Report via ZOOM. She shared good news of East Jackson receiving 6 additional grants from State Aid. She is still working on the Budget Amendment and plans to have it ready to present in March.

2) Board Reports/ Sharing

- Misti Bell announced that 120 of the 200 tickets available for the March 4th Athletic Boosters Annual Cash Bash have been sold. The Boosters are hopeful to sell all 200 since 120 is their breakeven point. This event is their primary fundraiser and has been cancelled the last two years. Misti added that each ticket will receive a door prize and a gun raffle has been added in addition to over 20 baskets to raffle.
- Misti Bell shared that the youth girls' basketball tournament was a success with 30 teams
 entered and a full house of spectators. She added that there were many compliments on the
 facilities.

3) Superintendent's Report

- Superintendent, Steve Doerr reported that school districts in Jackson and Hillsdale Counties
 continue to focus on cybersecurity through strategic efforts, including updated firewalls,
 malware updates, and staff training. These proactive steps will be ongoing and help prevent
 cybersecurity threats.
- NEOLA legal updates were included in each Board member's packet along with a recommendation from NEOLA for the district to report Board member compensation on W-2's.
- Also in the Board packet was a letter from legal counsel regarding Health Education and Sex Education issues. The superintendent stated that the district continues to comply with all statutory guidelines in these areas.
- In the May 2, 2023 election, East Jackson will vote on 2 important ballot measures. First, the district is requesting a renewal of the Non-Homestead millage renewal. Second, the JCISD is requesting a renewal of the special education millage. The superintendent stressed the importance of these two elections; each having an impact on the district's operating budget.
- Mr. Doerr highlighted two (2) significant celebrations in January. The district honored Judy Devereaux, the first female varsity letter winner at East Jackson. Also, Big Brothers Big Sisters recognized East Jackson as Educational Partner of the Year. Three EJ students also received special recognition: Emma Mapes, Mason Dingee, and Cooper Pelton.
- School safety issues continue to evolve. Schools around our state were the victims of "swatting" in early February, including Jackson High School. EJ administration is in ongoing, regular collaboration with area law enforcement to maximize school safety for staff and students.
