A GLIMPSE OF HISTORY

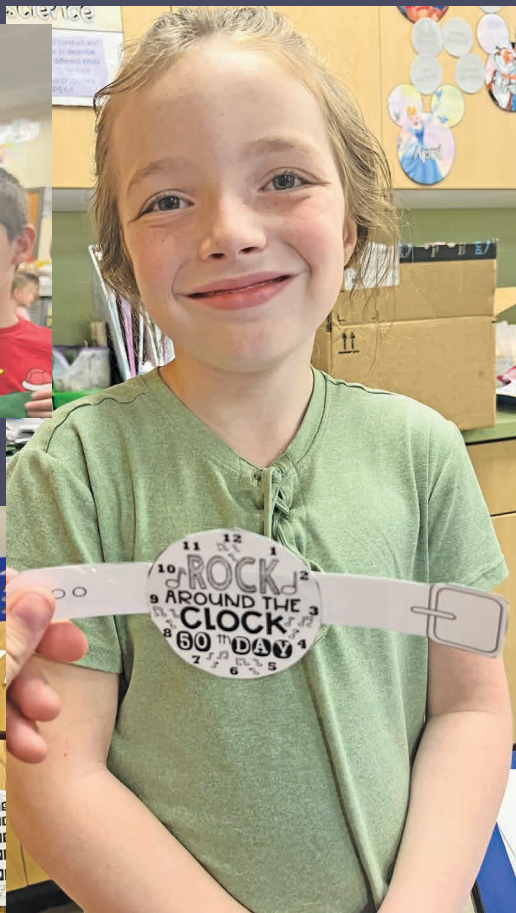
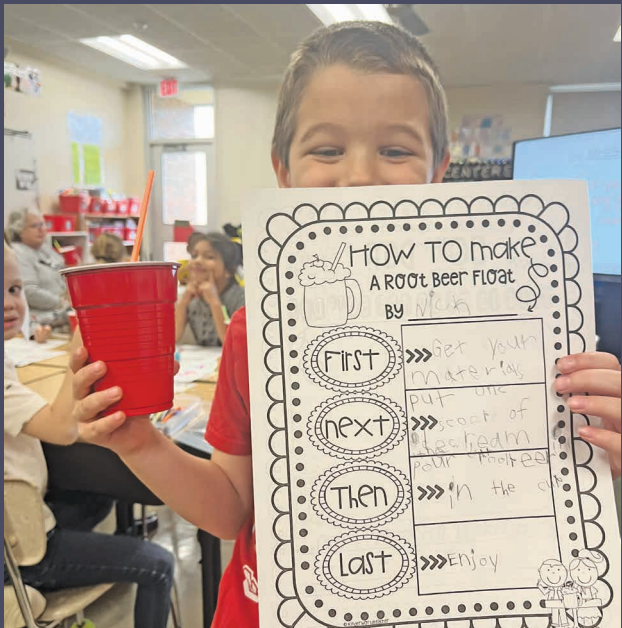

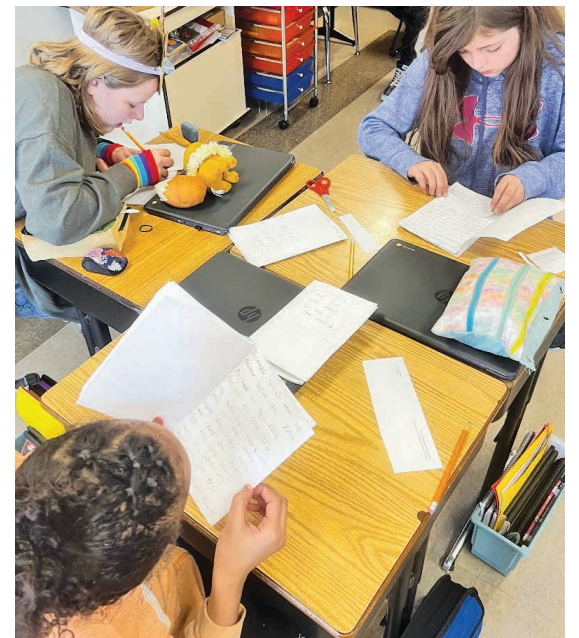
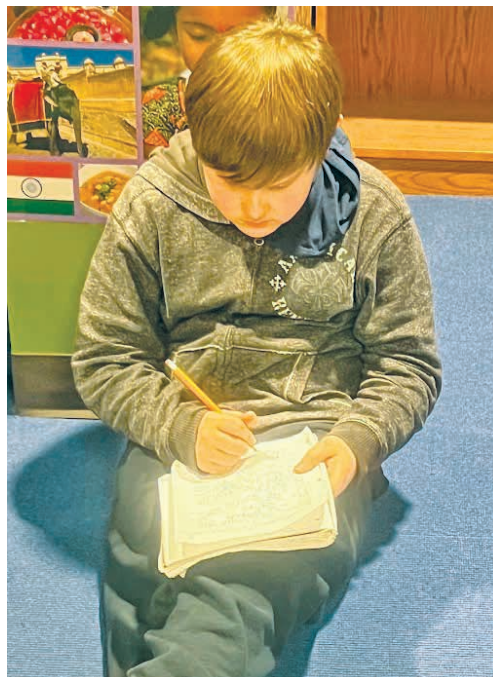
FIRST FULL YEAR

Mrs. Miller’s elementary students participate in music every week. They are learning about musical instruments, different genres of music, cultures of music, how to analyze what they hear while also learning how to read and perform the language of music.

Our 6th grade beginning band students are learning a wind instrument of their choice. At the beginning of the second semester, students are also enjoying learning percussion instruments including the snare and bass drums, bells, and the suspended and crash cymbals. Students also have the opportunity to come to sectionals during their school day allowing them time to work together, get specific help from the director, or to play together as a small ensemble. The

students are supportive of each other, becoming leaders of the band and our school community, and are energized about their excellent progress they have already made as the beginning band. It is exciting to hear their growth and feel their enthusiasm as we look towards their future in the EJ Band program.

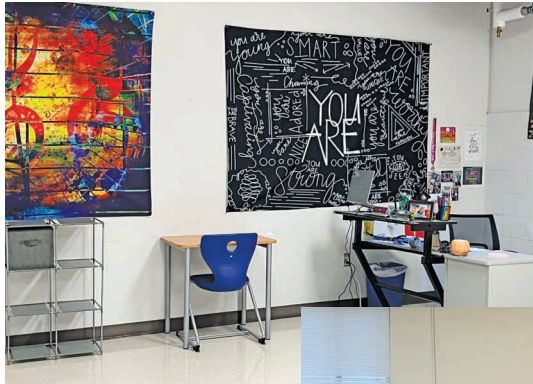
GOALS DRAWING

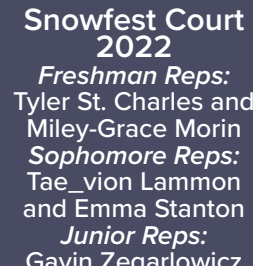
PRIME TIME AT EJSS

This year East Jackson Secondary School was extremely fortunate to receive a robust grant from SME PRIME (Partnership Response in Manufacturing Education). SME PRIME builds cost-effective and tailored manufacturing/engineering programs in high schools across the country. They provide equipment, curriculum, scholarships, and STEM-focused extra-curricular activities to students and teachers. EJSS Science teachers Beth Sanborn and Phillip Jordon have attended multiple trainings which equip them to certify our PRIME students in areas such as PMI (Precision Measurement), Mechatronics, 3D printing, etc. Local companies, such as Technique and LOMAR, actively partner with our PRIME class to provide materials, instruction, and guidance. PRIME students receive invaluable hands-on training on modern equipment. The goal is for students to have multiple certifications and be “job ready” by the time they graduate from EJSS.

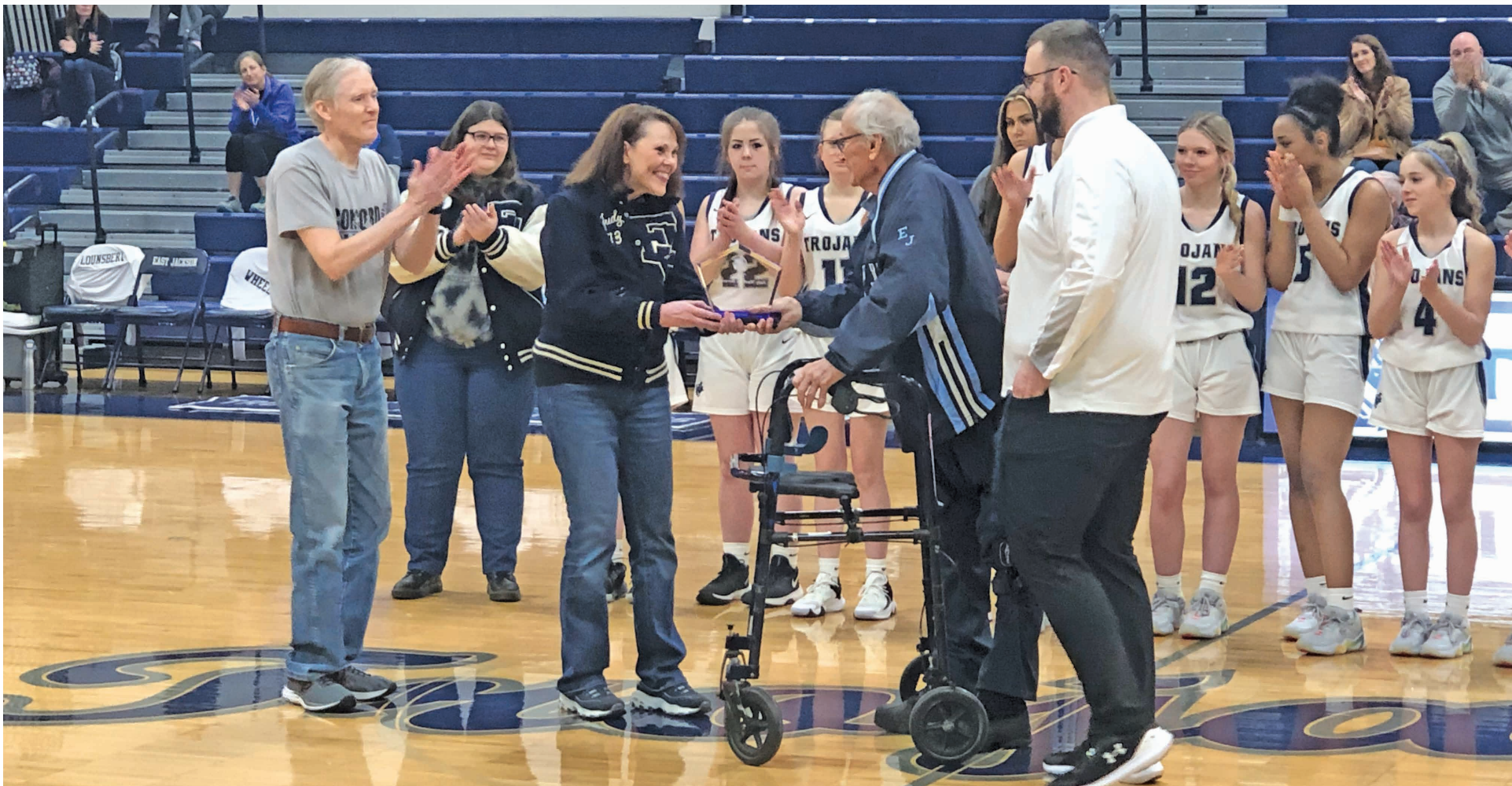
