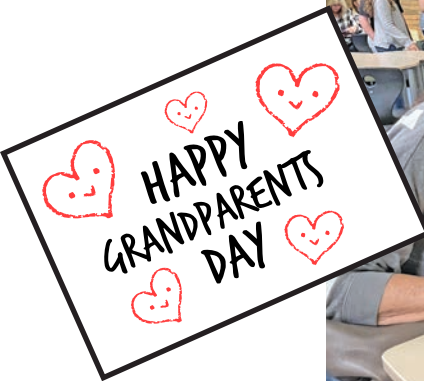
PBIS AT EJE

SCHOOL YEAR “MEME-ORIES”

We all know that kids love memes, especially middle-school students. Heck, all of us sometimes get a little chuckle from them.

Questioning, advice, hashtag, emotional, reflection, trendy, “be like....”, “don’t be like....” ---

Internet memes may seem like a funny image and a few words put together to create laughter, but they are so much more. They are thoughts remixed, copied, and circulated to bring focus to a common topic within a community.

For an end-of-the-year activity in the 2022-23 school year, the 6th-grade students were able to express their point-of-view through the creation of their own memes. First, we analyzed the different types of memes. This could have been in the form of giving advice, asking and/or answering a question, an emotion felt during a moment in the school year, what students should or should not be doing in school, or a reflection of the school year. 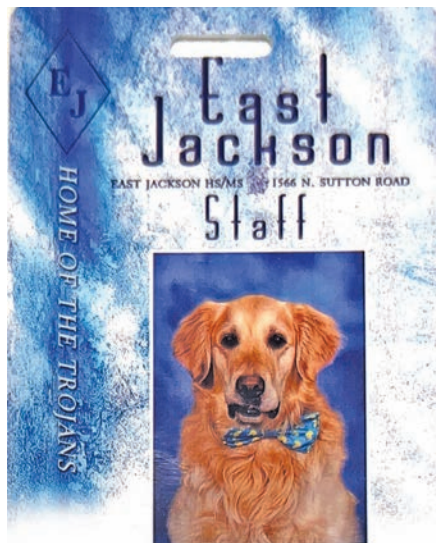

"The therapy dog thing" has been a hit and having Murphy in our building is a benefit to everyone!

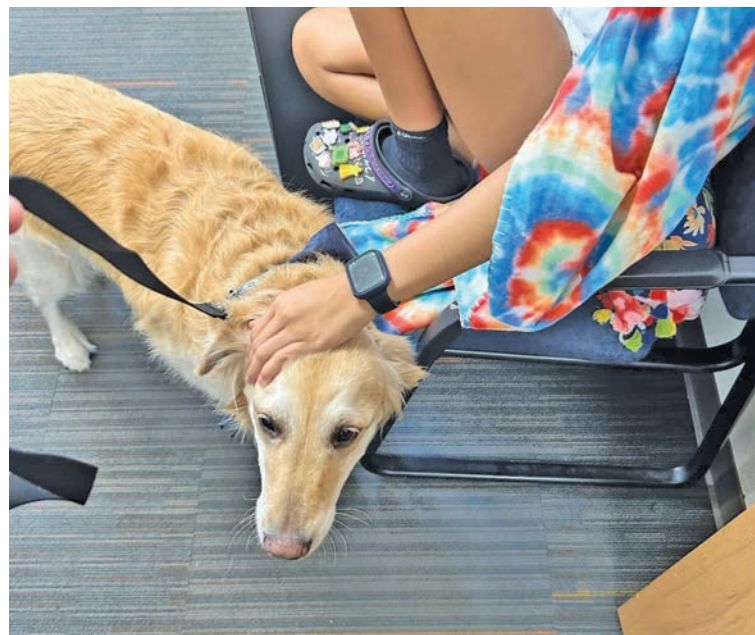

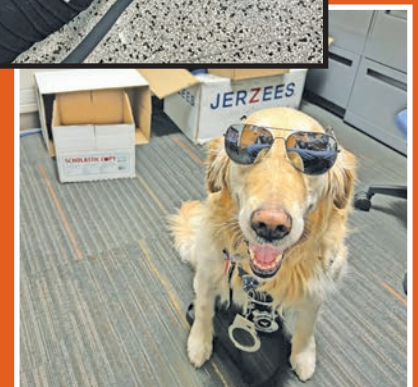
