# **WHY MUSIC?**

Whenever and wherever humans have existed, music has existed also. Since music occurs only when people choose to create and share it, and since they have always done so and no doubt always will, music clearly must have important value for people. -Housewright Symposium on the Future of Music Education, 2000

In music specials, the students sing, play music, and play body percussion. They also learn pitch, melody, rhythm, posture, diction, steady beat, focus, improvising, key center, inferring and sequencing song stories. While listening to music, the students learn instrument names, sounds, shapes, genres of music, families, and music terms such as timbre, tempo, libra, dynamics, articulation, and mood.

Read and listen to sound stories about music and instruments; Kids learn how to identify instruments by sound and sight, practice inferring, sequencing, plot, characters, and actions with words and musical sound

Analyze music 's connection with other disciplines; Kids learn how music connects with ELA & Math doing cross-curricular activities along with musical SEL themes that make connections to their life.

Our beginning band at East Jackson Elementary has rolled out the percussion instruments including the snare and bass drums, bells, suspended and crash cymbals along with continuing their wind instruments from the woodwind and brass families. This year, we are having lots of fun together with students playing multiple instruments. They are learning each instrument with lightning speed. This year's beginning band students are motivating each other, leading their ensemble, and making commendable progress during their first year in band. Their energy and talent bring great excitement as we look towards their future in the EJ Band program. A special thank you to the EJE PTCO for the purchase of two trumpets for us to play and become our best musicians.




# GETTING THERE WITH MS. VOGT'S CLASS

This bond vote is structured as a NO MILL increase from the current levy.

- A "NO" vote will not cause your property tax rate to decrease.
- A "YES" vote will not cause your property tax rate to increase.

#### You may vote either:

- In-person in the location where you normally vote in local, state, and national elections.
   In-person voting is open on Tuesday, May 7 from 7AM 8PM.
- Absentee Ballots will be available at your local Township Clerk's Office beginning March 28.

#### Bond proceeds CANNOT be used for:

- General operating expenses or maintenance
- Classroom textbooks or educational materials
- Administration, professional or support staff benefits, salaries, or wages
